





Before you travel, what do you learn about your \*destination? There

are a lot of things to find out about the \*2local language, money, tourist

places, and so on. These are practical, but it is also important to study

something else: local etiquette. This is so that you will know the rules of

daily life.

There are a couple of reasons to learn these rules. One is to show

respect for the local culture. People like it when they see that. Another

reason is to avoid causing problems. For instance, in many countries, it is

rude to eat noisily. So, if you eat your soup like that in a restaurant,

another customer might feel angry and enjoy their meal less.

It is easy to avoid many problems if you prepare. A lot of travel

guides include etiquette tips. You could also go online or ask other

people for advice. If you do accidentally upset someone, say sorry. Then,

try to discover what you did wrong. That way, you can avoid making

mistakes again.
